FEDERAL BUILDING SECURITY

Since NRCS is headquartered in the Bennett Federal Building at 125 S Main in Salt Lake City, we wanted to pass along a few notes from a recent meeting with new Building Manager Andrew Lenz and Area Security Commander Ron Osborne. These reminders can benefit NRCS employees working in the building, area and field staff who visit the building, and partners who visit for meetings and to conduct business.

- Do not extend your parking beyond the 2 hour limit in the south west visitor parking lot—tickets will be written.
- Federal employees working or visiting the building must wear their security badges around their necks with clear visibility.
- No “piggybacking” when entering federal building security doors behind someone else—be prepared to be “challenged” for your federal ID badge.
- Visitors must present a valid photo ID, go through security clearance, and then wear the supplied visitor sticker while in the building.
- No concealed weapons are allowed within the confines of the federal building.

State Conservationist Dave Brown has asked that all employees take seriously their responsibility to be vigilant about security and protection of employees and equipment in all of our office buildings.
